

HOW TO LEAVE A BEQUEST

Once you have chosen the area you would most like to support, there are different ways to make a gift:



- A pecuniary gift you can leave a set sum of money or a percentage of your estate to St Paul's
- A residuary gift is a
- balance of your estate A specific gift - a nonmonetary legacy, by which you can leave assets, for example life insurance, stocks and shares, antiques, works of art or other valuables
- A reversionary gift a gift which will pass to St Paul's after another named recipient has enjoyed the income during their lifetime
- A memoriam gift is an immediate gift. This can be set up as a fund in remembrance of a loved one. In many schools, individuals establish 'In Memoriam' funds for providing scholarships, a bench or a tree on the school grounds.

HOW TO WORD YOUR GIFT

Making or amending your Will to include a gift to St Paul's is simple and free. Please contact your solicitor to arrange this for you. We recommend your solicitor uses the following wording in your Will for a bequest in support of St Paul's.

"I give (or bequeath) to St Paul's Foundation Ltd, a charitable trust registered with the New Zealand Charities Commission (CC36315) a sum of \$xx (or) xx% of my estate (or) xx, free of all charges and declare that the official receipt of St Paul's Foundation Ltd shall be sufficient acknowledgement of receiving this gift."

*St Paul's Foundation is a registered charity (CC36315) and adheres to best practice management of funds and will ensure your entrusted gift is administered in accordance with your wishes.
